It is my distinct honor and priviledge to present the 2019 Awardees of the Stephen Oluwole Awokoya Foundation For Science Education Postgraduate Scholarship.

When the Awokoya Foundation was started in 1995, some 24years ago, it was formed with the primary objective of promoting science and science education in institutions of higher learning in Nigeria.

In furtherance of this primary objective, the Foundation has made yearly awards of postgraduate scholarship for studies in the area of science and science education.

Our approach to the awarding of postgraduate scholarships is to reward excellence. The scholarship is awarded to the best students nominated from all the universities participating.

In the area of scholarship award, the Foundation has made a total of One Hundred and Thirteen (113) postgraduate scholarship awards to date.

SLIDE 3

The beneficiaries of these awards have come from twenty seven (27) different universities. The distribution of the one hundred and thirteen (113) scholarship awards among the 25 universities is shown on this slide.

The top five(5) universities are;
University of Lagos with twenty nine (29) awards,
The Unversity of Nigeria, Nsukka with Fourteen (14) awards
University of Ibadan with Twelve (12) awards,
Nnamdi Azikwe University with Seven awards,
Covenant University and Obafemi Awolowo University with six (6) awards each.

This then tapers down to the last twelve universities with one award each. This set includes for the first time Afe Bablola University and The Federal University of Technology Akure, which are just receiving awards for the first time this year.

SLIDE 4

The process for the award of the scholarship starts with the nomination of candidates by the deans of the various faculties or heads of departments related to science or science education at the tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

The nominees are expected to be the best graduating students from the various tertiary institutions.

The scholarship awardees are chosen based on excellence in educational performance, stated long-term objectives and an interview of the shortlisted candidates by the Board of Trustees.

It is important to note that the scholarship is not based on need but on excellence in educational performance.

In order to qualify for this award, you have to be very good in your educational performance both in your university and in comparison to other students in other universities.

The Awokoya Foundation scholarship is a reward for excellence and it is aimed at encouraging excellence in educational performance.

It is an award for the best among the best.

SLIDE 5

This year, we had 150 nominations from 42 universities.

The distribution of the nominations is shown on this slide,

The top three universities with the highest number of nominations were;

The University of Lagos with 21 nominations.

Federal University of Technology, Akure with twelve(12) nominations and Sokoto State University with ten(10) nominations

On the low end of the number of nominations are the last fifteen (15) universities with one(1) nomination each, from Abia State University to the University of Jos on the bottom right hand side of the slide.

SLIDE 6

Out of the 150 nominations, there were

- 111 First Class Graduates or graduates with Distinctions
- 33 Second Class Upper Honours Graduates
- 6 Not Classified . This includes courses like Medicine and current students

SLIDE 7

The postgraduate scholarship award covers tuition and Board.
The value is now Three Hundred Thousand Naira (N=300,000) per student per annum.

It is renewable each year, for a maximum of three years, provided the awardee maintains a good record of academic performance as attested to by the authorities of the university he or she attends.

It is tenable in any Nigerian university.

For nominees that have admission into foreign universities, we convert the scholarship into a travel grant.

This year we have eight (8) postgraduate scholarship awardees chosen from the nominations received.

The first awardee for the Postgraduate Scholarship of the Stephen Oluwole Awokoya Foundation for Science Education for the year 2019 is Mr. Joshua Adewolu.

SLIDE 9

Mr. Adewolu, please come up to the rostrum.

Mr. Adewolu attended the Neebenebor International School in Benin City for his primary schooling and the

Igbinedion Education Centre also in Benin-City for his secondary schooling.

He had 9 distinctions out of nine (9) subjects in his Senior School Certificate exams and later went to study Mechatronics Engineering at the Afe Babalola University in Ado-Ekiti, where he graduated with a First Class honours degree, with a cumulative Grade point average of 4.88. He was the best graduating student in the Department of Mechanical and Mechatronics Engineering of the Afe Babalola University for the 2017/2018 session.

Mr Adewolu intends to pursue a masters course in Mechatronics Engineering. **SLIDE 10**

The second awardee is Miss Oseremen Joy Idialu.

Miss Idialu, please come up to the rostrum.

Miss Idialu went to Word of Faith primary and secondary schools, both in Abuja. She had eight (8) distinctions in the nine(9) subjects she sat for in her SSCE exams. She later went to Redeemer's University where she studied computer science. She graduated with a first class degree in Computer Science with a cumulative grade point average of 4.98. Her cumulative grade point average of 4.98 was the highest ever recorded at Redemmer's University

Miss Idialu will be going for a Master of science degree in computer science. **SLIDE 11**

The third awardee is Mr. Laughter Fiyinfoluwa Olagunju

Mr. Olagunju, please come up to the rostrum.

Mr. Olagunju attended both the Sundest Progressive College and Our Lady and St. Francis Catholic College in Osogbo, Osun State for his secondary schooling.

He got 8 distinctions including 5 A1s in the nine courses he took in his senior school certificate exams.

He later attended Federal University of Technology, Akure, where he studied Architecture and graduated with a First Class Honours degree, with a

cumulative grade point average of 4.57. He was the best graduating student in 2017/2018 set.

Mr. Olagunju intends to pursue a masters degree in Architecture. **SLIDE 12**

The fourth awardee is Miss Adedoyin Olutoyin Adeyemi.

Miss Adeyemi please come up to the rostrum.

Miss Adeyemi attended Cenfex High School in Mokola Estate in Ibadan, Oyo State, for her secondary schooling.

She got nine(9) distinctions in the nine subjects she took in her SSC exams. including four(4) A1s.

She studied Microbiology at the University of Ibadan, where she graduated with a B.Sc First Class honours degree with a cumulative grade point average of 6.7 out of a maximum of 7. She was the best graduating student in Microbiology for her set.

Miss Adeyemi will be pursuing a postgraduate degree in microbiology. **SLIDE 13**

The fifth awardee is Mr. Obinwanne Enewally

Mr. Enewally, please come up to the rostrum.

Mr Enewally attended the International School at the Universty of Lagos for his secondary schooling.

He got eight (8) distinctions out of the nine subjects he sat for in his SSC exams, including 4 A1s.

He later attended the University of Lagos, where he studied Pharmacy and graduated with a cumulative grade point average of 4.87 out of a maximum of 5.

Mr. Enewally will be pursuing a masters degree in pharmacy.

Our sixth awardee is Mr. Chukwuemeka Nwagu

Mr Nwagu, please come up to the rostrum.

Mr Nwagu attended the University of Nigeria Primary School and Secondary School in Nsukka for his primary and secondary schooling.

He got nine (9) distinctions out of the nine subjects he sat for in his SSC exams, including 7 A1s.

He later attended University of Nigeria, Nsukka, where he studied Electronic Engineering and graduated with the best results in his department with a first class honours and cumulative grade point average of 4.83 out of a maximum of 5.0.

Mr. Nwagu will be pursuing a master's degree in electronic engineering. **SLIDE 15**

Our seventh awardee is Miss Patience Nnena Abugu Miss Abugu, please come up to the rostrum.

Miss Abugu attended the Housing Estate Nursery and Primary School, Abakpa-Nike, Enugu for her primary schooling. She also attended Aunty Alice College in Maramba, Nasarawa State and Federal Government Girls College, Bwari, Abuja for her secondary schooling.

She got nine (9) distinctions out of the nine subjects she sat for in her SSC exams, including 8 A1s.

She later attended University of Nigeria, Nsukka, where she studied Pure and Industrial Chemistry and graduated with a first class honours and a cumulative grade point average of 4.84 out of a maximum of 5.0.

Miss Abugu will be pursuing a masters degree in pure and industrial chemistry. **SLIDE 16**

Ladies and Gentlemen, the eight and final awardee of today is from the chemical and petroleum engineering department of the University of Lagos.

I would like to say a few words about the department of Chemical and Petroleum Engineering of the University of Lagos.

We don't get nominations every year from that department, but whenever we do, their nominated candidates tend to top our charts and metrics.

Ladies and Gentlemen, the eight and final awardee of today is Mr. Adeola Adeyemo.

Mr. Adeyemo, please come up to the rostrum.

Mr. Adeyemo attended Maryland Convent Private School in Maryland, Lagos for his primary schooling and the Apostolic Faith Secondary School in Anthony, Lagos for his secondary schooling.

He had nine (9) distinctions in the 9 subjects that he took in his SSC exams including seven (7) A1.

He later attended the University of Lagos to study Chemical and Petroleum Engineering .

He graduated at the top of his class with a first class honours B.Sc degree in Petroleum & Gas Engineering and 4.92 cummulative grade point average, with a GPA scale of a maximum of 5.0.

He was the President of the Student Chapter of the Society of Petroleum Engineers in his final year 2017/2018

Mr. Adeyemo will be pursuing a postgraduate degree in Petroleum and Gas Engineerung,
